
Resurrection: New Testament 40 Verses (NIV)

G386 ανάστασις anastasis an-as'-tas-is

From G450; a standing up again, that is, (literally) a resurrection from death (individual, general or by implication (its author)), or (figuratively) a (moral) recovery (of spiritual truth): - raised to life again, resurrection, rise from the dead, that should rise, rising again.


Resurrection Old Testament 0 Verses NIV (Are you Pharisee or Sadducee?)

Ezekiel 37 includes the vision of dry bones springing to life by God's word.


The Pharisees and Sadducees disagreed about resurrection.

Paul uses this to his advantage in (Acts 23: 6-11 NIV)

Then Paul, knowing that some of them were Sadducees and the others Pharisees, called out in the Sanhedrin, "My brothers, I am a Pharisee, descended from Pharisees. I stand on trial because of the hope of the resurrection of the dead." When he said this, a dispute broke out between the Pharisees and the Sadducees, and the assembly was divided. (The Sadducees say that there is no resurrection, and that there are neither angels nor spirits, but the Pharisees believe all these things.) There was a great uproar, and some of the teachers of the law who were Pharisees stood up and argued vigorously. "We find nothing wrong with this man," they said. "What if a spirit or an angel has spoken to him?" The dispute became so violent that the commander was afraid Paul would be torn to pieces by them. He ordered the troops to go down and take him away from them by force and bring him into the barracks. The following night the Lord stood near Paul and said, "Take courage! As you have testified about me in Jerusalem, so you must also testify in Rome."

Resurrection and the Life (Αναστασις και η ζωη) A John phrase?

Both words are in some versions -inc. more literal translations. John 5:29



Perhaps the same John wrote Revelation:

(Rev 20:5 NIV) (The rest of the dead did not come to life until the thousand years were ended.) This is the first resurrection.

Bible has 40+ different authors. The Author of Hebrews also debatable.

(Heb 11:35 NIV) Women received back their dead, raised to life again. There were others who were tortured, refusing to be released so that they might gain an even better resurrection.

Both words are not in many other versions.

'Life' not in this section of the NT Greek (GNT) I use.

Other verses with Resurrection:

(Matthew 22:23-32 NIV) That same day the Sadducees, who say there is no resurrection, came to him with a question. Now there were seven brothers among us. The first one married and died, and since he had no children, he left his wife to his brother. The same thing happened to the second and third brother, right on down to the seventh. Finally, the woman died. Now then, at the resurrection, whose wife will she be of the seven, since all of them were married to her?" Jesus replied, "You are in error because you do not know the Scriptures or the power of God. At the resurrection people will neither marry nor be given in marriage; they will be like the angels in heaven. But about the resurrection of the dead—have you not read what God said to you, 'I am the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob'? He is not the God of the dead but of the living." (c.f. Luke 20:27-40)

(Acts 2:31 NIV) Seeing what was to come, he spoke of the resurrection of the Messiah, that he was not abandoned to the realm of the dead, nor did his body see decay. (Acts 4:33 NIV) With great power the apostles continued to testify to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus. And God's grace was so powerfully at work in them all

(Romans 6:5 NIV) For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly also be united with him in a resurrection like his.

(1 Corinthians 15:29 NIV) Now if there is no resurrection, what will those do who are baptized for the dead? If the dead are not raised at all, why are people baptized for them? (1 Corinthians 15:42 NIV) So will it be with the resurrection of the dead. The body that is sown is perishable, it is raised imperishable;

(Philippians 3:10-11 NIV) I want to know Christ—yes, to know the power of his resurrection and participation in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, and so, somehow, attaining to the resurrection from the dead.

(1 Peter 3:21 NIV) and this water symbolizes baptism that now saves you also—not the removal of dirt from the body but the pledge of a clear conscience toward God. It saves you by the resurrection of Jesus Christ,
